Cleaning Of Coffee Maker with Vinegar Vinegar is the one of the effective cleaners to clean various household things. The Acetic acidic property makes it a great cleanser. It works effectively for removing dirt and grime around the home. You can clean coffee maker with vinegar by following steps: 1.Fill the coffee maker reservoir with an equal amount of water and vinegar. Start brew cycle till it makes half empty. 3.Allow the coffee maker sit till one hour to clean out any mold in a coffee maker. 4.Turn on the coffee maker and run rest of the brew cycle. Run two brew cycles with clean water to clean out the vinegar from coffee maker wholly. Drawbacks Of Cleaning With Vinegar Many of you know vinegar as a good cleaning agent. Though it is a great cleanser, it doesn't work well for certain things. Like degreasing range hood, cleaning mildew in the bathroom, descaling coffee maker etc. Let's get to know some drawbacks of using vinegar as cleaning agent: It is highly acidic cleaning agent. So, this can affect the human health. The most importantly, it cannot kill the germs completely. It is not registered with EPA as an effective disinfectant. So, it doesn't kill the 99.99% bacteria. When you clean your coffee maker with vinegar, it left strong odor to a coffee maker. So, you need to rinse it repeatedly. It doubles your job of cleaning. This also consumes a lot of time and water. The flavor of vinegar cannot be gone just in the first rinse. You should rinse it more times to remove flavor completely. If you are not ready to compromise with the flavor of coffee, you can use other cleaning products which are equally effective. Lemon juice contains an equal level of acidity as vinegar. You know the best part? It doesn't leave the strong odor behind. You can use manually squeezed lemon or you can buy prepackaged lemon juice for cleaning purpose. Steps to use lemon to clean out your coffee maker: Run a cycle by filling only water to remove coffee residue if any. Turn it off when the cycle will complete. Mix a half cup of lemon juice with a half cup of water. Fill the water reservoir with a lemon-water solution. Allow it sit for 15 minutes. Put clean filter into the coffee maker and turn it on. Allow running the cycle with a lemon solution. Run the cycle once or twice with only using water to remove lemon residue. Wash the inside of coffee carafe and the basket with the sponge dabbed in lemon juice. Wash the detachable parts with soapy water. 2.Baking Soda Baking soda is pure and natural cleaning agent which is non-toxic also. Due to mild Alkali, it is a great grease and dirt removal. Detach the filter from a coffee maker and keep it aside. Fill the coffee pot with 1 cup of lukewarm water. Add ¼ cup of baking soda in coffee pot and stir it to dissolve the baking soda. Transfer the baking soda solution to water reservoir and replace the empty coffee carafe to its place. Turn on the coffee maker and allow it to run a brew cycle completely. It cleans the coffee maker and the baking soda solution return in coffee pot with dirt. Remove the dirty water from coffee pot. Fill the water reservoir with only water. Let run the cycle till it finishes. If water doesn't come back clean, you will need to run one more cycle. You can get baking soda to clean out your coffeemaker by clicking here. 3. Bleach Yes, you can use bleach to clean your coffee maker but with some precautions. It is highly corrosive, so don't use it excessively otherwise it leads to damage to your coffee maker. Make sure never directly use bleach into your automatic coffee maker. To clean your coffee maker with bleach: Take 4 cups of water and mix 2 tablespoons of bleach. Place filter paper in a coffee maker. Transfer the bleach solution in the coffee maker and pour more water. Turn the coffee maker on and unplug it after few minutes. Wash the coffee maker with just only water quite a lot of times to remove the bleach residue. It is a natural ingredient that you can use without any risk. The acid present in this ingredient helps to remove stains. It can erode the limescale build up from your coffee maker just like vinegar does. Fill the coffee pot with water and pour 3 tablespoons of cream of tartar. Keep stirring solution until cream of tartar dissolved fully. Run water through coffee maker. When pot is getting full, allow the water to cool. Scrub the pot with sponge and rinse the pot thoroughly. You can get cream of tartar By clicking here. 5. Hydrogen Peroxide Hydrogen peroxide is chemically known as H2O2. It is the ultra-cheap cleaner as a 16oz bottle of hydrogen peroxide only costs around a buck. It is the most common disinfectant you may find at home. You can use it to clean and disinfect your coffee maker with following steps: Pour 1 cup of hydrogen peroxide into your coffee carafe. Fill the coffee carafe with water and pour into the coffee maker. Place the coffee pot under the brew basket. Turn on the coffee maker and let the cycle finish. Repeat the cycle twice with only water to clean out hydrogen peroxide. 6. CLR If lemon juice remedy doesn't work for descaling your coffee maker, you can try CLR (Calcium, Lime and Rust remover). It can remove the build-up of calcium and rust from hard water. Following are the steps to use CLR to clean coffee maker: Run clean water through the coffee maker to remove residue from the last brew. Mix 1 part of CLR with 8 parts of water. Transfer the solution to the reservoir of coffee maker. Let run the brew cycle completely. Run the coffee maker with just adding water 3 or 4 times till all CLR smell has gone wholly. Denture tablets You might not have heard of denture tablets to clean your coffee maker. But, yes you can clean your coffee maker with denture tablets as they can remove easily stubborn deposits of minerals. Let's get to know how to clean coffee maker step by step: Fill the container with the warm water. Let drop only two denture tablets into it. And make sure all tablets are dissolved in water entirely. Run your coffee maker till cycle finishes. Run two or more brew cycles with clean water. 8. Dish-washing liquid Cleaning your coffee maker with mild dishwashing liquid is the easiest and fastest way to clean. You only need to separate all the detachable parts of the coffee maker. Rinse and clean the parts with Dishwashing liquid. And you have done the job! 9.Alcohol/Vodka This method is one of the cheapest way to clean out your coffee maker. Vodka has no smell or taste which makes it perfect to clean out your coffee maker. Alcohol is powerful detergent to remove the coffee residue. You just need to wipe down the inside of coffee maker with substantial amount of vodka or alcohol. In fact, you need to clean the all parts which comes into contact with water. You can clean your coffee maker by mixing Vodka or alcohol 25% with water. Run through the coffee maker. Then run clear water twice through the coffee maker. 10. Muriatic Acid Muriatic acid is also known as Hydrochloric acid. It is a solution of Hydrogen Chloride in water. It is commonly used for removing stubborn stains. You can clean coffee maker with this muriatic acid with following steps: Take out all detachable parts of coffee maker. Mix four parts of water with 1 part of muriatic acid. In a bucket take water first always then add muriatic acid. Fill another bucket with water and pour baking soda in it. Soak the parts in muriatic acid for 5-7 minutes. Dip the parts in a bucket filled with baking soda and water solution. Now chemical reaction occurs, so be careful! Here baking soda neutralizes the muriatic acid and removes the scale completely with ease. Rinse the parts using a lot of water. Precaution: Muriatic acid does an amazing job to remove scaling from your coffee maker. But always keep in mind your safety first. It has highly corrosive properties, so it should be diluted with water for cleaning purpose. Always transfer acid into water, not water into acid. Use safety gears like hand gloves, safety glasses while cleaning. 11.Borax The Borax is the multipurpose household cleaner which can be used to clean floor, sink, fridge, coffee maker etc. It doesn't leave any chemical film after cleaning. So, it is a great cleaner to clean every part of your home. Add the water in water reservoir of coffee maker. Then add 2 tablespoons of Borax in the water reservoir of coffee maker. The acidic nature of lemon juice renders it the same properties as that of white vinegar. This agent makes it quite a capable candidate for cleaning your coffee pot. All you need to do is prepare a slightly diluted solution of lemon juice with its goodness of citric acid. Just like you would have run the white vinegar through the machine, run this lemon juice solution instead. Once the process has been done quite a few times, rinse the coffee pot with regular clean water. Using Borax Borax, also known as sanitizing borax, is yet another famous cleansing agent. It is commonly used to clean equipment like washing machines, fridges, and, of course, coffee makers. It is a multipurpose household cleaner used quite often as a substitute for white vinegar. For using borax to clean your coffee machine, you need to prepare a few tablespoons of borax with warm water. Mix it well. Run this solution mixture through your coffee machine. Keep the brew speed medium or heavy brew till the borax solution is running. After the cleaning is complete, rinse the coffee pot with fresh and clean water at least twice before the next time you start brewing coffee. Using Baking Soda Baking soda has been popularly used as a non-toxic cleaning agent since time immemorial. It is affordable and easy to obtain, and it gets the job done. Unlike other cleaning products, baking soda is alkaline, i.e., basic. The alkaline properties provide it an edge over other cleaning products. To use baking soda for cleaning your coffee machine, mix a quarter cup of baking soda in one cup of warm water. Make sure there are no power lumps, and the liquid is smooth. Use this liquid to run through the machine's system. Repeat the cycle till you are satisfied with the cleaning. Rinse the system with plain water after the procedure is complete. All you need to do is fill the water reservoir with water and add two to three spoons of cream of tartar to it. Let this solution run through the system two to three times, and then flush it out with fresh water. Using Dishwashing Liquid We use dishwashing liquids and dish soap on our most expensive china, without the worry of them getting ruined. Why not use this same cleanser for your drip coffee maker as well? Dishwashing liquids are prepared for the sole purpose of making your utensils sparkling clean. You can use them with convenience for any kitchenware. The only problem with using dishwashing liquid is that you will be required to disassemble your coffeemaker completely. If you are comfortable doing so, this is one of the best ways to keep your machine clean. For using a dishwashing liquid, disassemble your coffee maker and separate the housing and functional components. Prepare a solution of cleaning solution and soapy water and wash the separated parts with the same. Avoid using a scrub pad; instead, wash it with your hands. Soak the separate parts in the solution of muriamic acid for 3 to 4 minutes. This cleaning agent will help in removing all the stains. Now dip the pieces in baking soda solution to nullify the acidic reaction.
